★ Ornamental band or chain worn around the arm or wrist.

★ Four iron spikes joined together so that when the caltrop is on the ground a spike is always pointing upwards. Used to disable infantry and cavalry.

★ A strip of lead holding small pieces of glass (quarries) in a window.

 \bigstar A three dimensional representation usually done in wood, ivory or stone.

★ An object which contains or is inscribed with spells against disease, witchcraft etc, or providing luck to the wearer.

 \star A gaming piece used specifically to play chess.

CHISEL
